We suggest closer to the removal day, if you are a cat owner paying extra attention to them to the run up to the moving date as cats can sometimes have a harder time adjusting to the move.

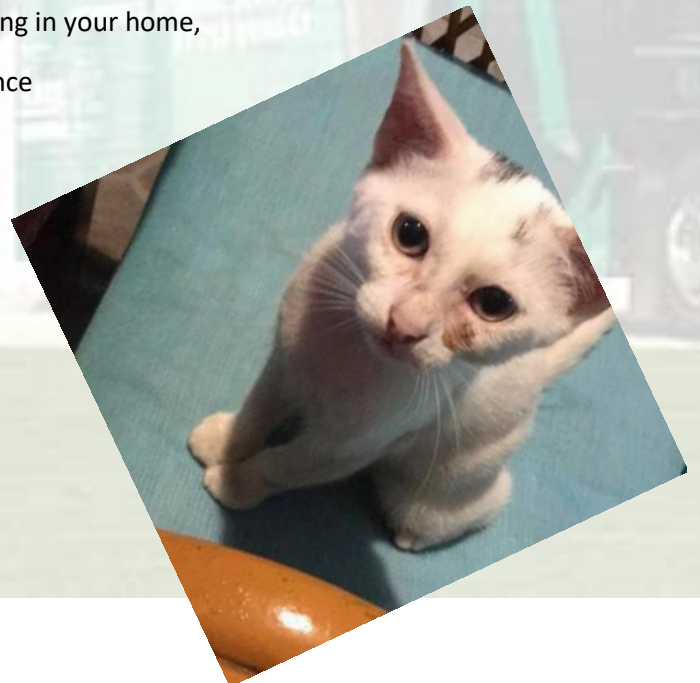
Keeping them inside for the last few days remaining in your home,
